LAUNCHING THE GOOD GOVERNANCE AND CITIZENSHIP OBSERVATORY

Housed at the Asfari Institute for Civil Society and Citizenship, the Good Governance and Citizenship Observatory (GGCO) at AUB was officially launched in December 2023.

Through GGCO, the Asfari Insitute aims to empower citizens to actively participate in public life, champion good governance and innovation, shape policymaking with evidence-based insights, and provide a collaborative platform for experts, policymakers, and civil society organizations to drive positive societal change.

The observatory explores citizenship across three pillars:

- 1. governance, public sector reform, and education;
- 2. mobilities and migration; and
- 3. constitutions and legal frameworks.

EMPHASIZING DIALOGUE ON CITIZENSHIP AND NATION-BUILDING

In May 2023, the Asfari Institute, in collaboration with the Department of Political Science and Public Administration, the Mohammad Atallah Chair for Ethics at AUB, and Carnegie Middle East Center, launched the "Re-Imagining Citizenship Inaugural Conference."

This annual event convenes thought leaders and practitioners to stimulate conversations about citizenship, nation-building, and inclusion amid enduring conflicts. It aims to create a vision that promotes more inclusive and equitable citizenship practices, contributing to positive social change, especially in conflict and crisis-affected regions.

03 | BUILDING A CIVIL SOCIETY LEARNING AND EXCHANGE HUB

COURSES AND CERTIFICATES

Certificate in Influencing and Political Acumen:

In collaboration with the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) and Asfari Foundation, the Asfari Institute kicked off a new certificate aimed at empowering civil society to address their specific needs when challenging established norms and practices. The certificate enhances the advocacy skills of CSOs in regions marked by endemic conflict and equips them to serve as agents of transformative change, contributing to the development of equitable societies in the region.

Empowered Voices Self-Paced Courses:

The Asfari Institute is developing an online educational platform of self-paced courses on inclusive political participation. This platform aims to increase understanding and foster awareness of inclusive political participation in Lebanon and the region, contributing to a more inclusive and equitable political landscape that amplifies the least heard voices and perspectives.

A NEW HUB FOR CIVIL SOCIETY IN THE REGION


In collaboration with the Asfari Foundation, the Asfari Institute developed a platform that aims to promote inter-civil society organizations dialogue and exchange of knowledge in the MENA region entitled *Midan: A Knowledge Hub for Civil Society.* Midan offers CSOs and activists from the region the space to amplify the visibility of their knowledge products and make locally produced knowledge production more accessible for researchers and activists in the region.



VISIT TO UNIVERSITÉ DE MONTREAL AS PART OF THE GIPS RESEARCH PROJECT.

In November 2023, the Asfari Institute team, represented by Carla Akil, visited the Québec team of the Gender, (Im)mobilities, and Precarious Situation (GIPS) Project. This project, in collaboration with Université de Montreal, focuses on the lived experience of migrant women in Lebanon and Québec, Canada. The visit aimed to strengthen collaboration and understanding of shared goals. The visit included fruitful discussions with Québec team members to enhance joint initiatives. Carla also met with local partners to express gratitude for their support and explore new avenues of cooperation for future strategies.

In May 2023, the Asfari Institute, in partnership with the IDRC Research Chair on Forced Displacement and the Mohammad Atallah Chair for Ethics at AUB, launched the Annual Collaborative Program on Forced Migration. This initiative addresses the challenges of forced displacement by fostering dialogue and sharing research. It extends beyond the annual conference, driving collective efforts to support displaced populations and work toward sustainable solutions to one of the most urgent humanitarian crises of our time.



CHANGING THE RHETORIC ON CARE WORK AND ENGAGING CIVIL SOCIETY IN THE SWANA REGION

GLOBAL ALLIANCE FOR CARE: MOBILIZING ENGAGEMENT IN THE ARAB STATES INTERACTIVE MULTISTAKEHOLDER DIALOGUE

In collaboration with the Government of Mexico and UN Women, the Asfari Institute facilitated a discussion that allowed various stakeholders to participate in a conversation regarding the state of both paid and unpaid care work in the Arab region, as well as the challenges and prospects for promoting the care agenda in the region. Additionally, participants had the chance to gain insights into the Global Alliance for Care, its focus areas, accomplishments, and avenues for involvement in advancing a Regional Strategy on Care for the Arab Region.

CARE SMALL RESEARCH GRANT

In partnership with the Global Alliance for Care, the Asfari Institute initiated an open call for small research grant applications targeting scholars, activists, and researchers interested in exploring the overlooked dimensions of care work and its significant societal implications. By supporting this research, the Asfari Institute fosters a deeper understanding of the societal implications of care work, which will, in turn, inform civil society-led policy changes and societal attitudes toward care work in the MENA/SWANA region.









... AND ONGOING SUPPORT FOR OUR STUDENTS

We aim to establish a safe space and environment for our students and, above all, to provide them with unwavering support during their most significant accomplishments.

1. DR. HASSAN ABBAS AWARD IN CITIZENSHIP & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The Asfari Institute at the American University of Beirut established the Dr. Hassan Abbas Award in Citizenship and Social Justice in memory of Dr. Abbas, a distinguished figure known for his contributions to citizenship, social justice, and academia. The award is given to exceptional AUB students who exhibit academic excellence, a dedication to citizenship, social justice, and freedom, exemplary character, and a commitment to promoting tolerance and inclusivity. Dr. Abbas, a renowned author, scholar, and activist, left a lasting legacy, and this award honors his inspirational life and values. In 2023, the awardee of the Dr. Hassan Abbas Award in Citizenship & Social Justice was Rand Zeitoun.

2. HOSTING THESIS PRESENTATIONS AT THE ASFARI INSTITUTE

The Asfari Institute serves the students by offering them the space and support to defend their theses. In August 2023, MasterCard scholarship student Chancelyne Yein defended her master's thesis "A Critical Review of the Circular Economy Concept and Sustainable Development in Bamenda, Northwest Region of Cameroon" at the Asfari Institute Conference Hall 113.

3. HOSTING MEPI-TLS WORKSHOPS

The Asfari Institute hosted multiple MEPI-TLS workshops for students and staff on different gender topics, including feminist leadership, gender mainstreaming, feminist peacebuilding, gender in monitoring and evaluation, and feminist advocacy.

4. SUPPORTING STUDENT-LED INITIATIVES

As of 2023, the Asfari Institute hosts the first student-led digital gender publication platform, Mouzakara Jandariya (MJ). MJ sees writing as activism, striving to promote gender literacy on AUB campus and cultivate a culture of gender-focused writing among students. The platform offers a safe space for students to express themselves, facilitating quality content creation and publication with minimal restrictions. By empowering students to voice their perspectives, MJ promotes awareness and understanding of gender issues in the academic community.



09 | HIGHLIGHTS OF SOME OF OUR SELECTED HIGH-LEVEL EVENTS

EDUCATION AS AN EQUALIZER AND ENABLER:

The high-level policy forum, co-organized with the Malala Fund and the Issam Fares Institute shares research findings on the effects of austerity and restructuring programs on Lebanon's education sector in the context of potential IMF adjustments. The event emphasizes safeguarding education during economic reforms and influencing policy discussions in Lebanon.



SHIFTING NARRATIVES:

The Asfari Institute in partnership with the Nordic Embassies and the Nordic Council of Ministers organized a high-level event on the participation of women in upcoming municipal elections in Lebanon. The event aimed to enhance the advancement of gender equality and empower women to have a substantial role in shaping their communities.

FEMINIST FOREIGN POLICY:

The Asfari Institute in partnership with the Mexican Embassy in Beirut organized a networking event on feminist foreign policy. The event aimed to foster strong alliances and collaborative partnerships between diplomats, academia, policymakers, and CSOs to strengthen commitment toward feminist foreign policy.

The Asfari Institute for Civil Society and Citizenship expresses its unyielding solidarity with the innocent people of Gaza, Palestine. We are gravely concerned by the persistent breaches of international law and humanitarian principles in the region. As such, the Asfari Institute organized the Palestine Conversation Circles in collaboration with the Palestinian Land Studies Center (PLSC) at AUB, which is an event series aimed at informed discussions and facilitated knowledge exchange about the atrocious situation in Gaza.
